

Assemblies

These assemblies are intended to unify the students, teachers, and staff around knowledge of Mosaic lessons and language. Each is designed to highlight a specific Mosaic theme as it relates to school culture. Please select from our list of offerings below or tell us what you need and we can tailor-make an assembly for your school!

Your school will also receive access to our entire **Activity Bank** — our online searchable collection of over 40 activities and lessons for all ages that delve into Mosaic topics and tools for creating peaceful communities. Each assembly is paired with Recommended Activities from the Activity Bank that teachers can do with their students to deepen their learning.

After the assembly, you can also add on Classroom Workshops. Mosaic facilitators visit individual classroom to lead developmentally appropriate activities on the assembly's theme.

- **Mosaic Agreements**

New to Mosaic? Did you know that each letter in MOSAIC stands for a community agreement? Learn what each letter stands for by also learning what each does *not* stand for! Complete with silly skits and Mosaic's original songs, this assembly is perfect either as an introduction or a fun refresher.

- **Empathy**

What can we do when someone's feelings are hurt? How can we tell? Sadness and hurt can often look like anger or meanness. Through skits, song, and a story told from the perspective of a classic fairytale villain, students will understand that every story has more than one side. By practicing empathy, we can get to the *heart* of the problem and also prevent conflicts from arising.

- **Diversity**

We will celebrate differences and diversity as well as introduce the concepts of stereotyping, prejudice, and discrimination — and how to stop them!

- **Assertiveness**

We are often taught that when someone hurts us we must "stand up for ourselves", but what does that mean? Usually, we think the only options are to fight back, run away, or to ignore it and just let it happen. In this assembly, we explore the less common but most powerful option: assertiveness. We demonstrate the difference between assertive, passive, and aggressive. We show how assertiveness can be used to stop the spread of poison and spread peace instead.

- **Conflict Resolution**

Help our actors resolve their real-life conflict using the 5 Tools of Conflict Resolution, understanding that it's not all of us against each other—it's all of us against the problem!
