

Our lessons are not easily forgotten. When surveyed after five years, over 97% of responding alumni stated that, because of The Mosaic Project, they are more likely to empathize with those different from themselves, more likely

to interrupt discrimination, and better able to resolve conflicts peacefully. The surveys are also evidence of something else – that special lightning that Mosaic manages to capture in a bottle. One of the most common words our alumni use to describe their experience is "magical."



The GYC is a group of five recent high-school graduates who have committed this unusual year to personal and professional development with Mosaic. They meet on our beautiful new Castro Valley land, the site of Mosaic's future permanent home. The students participate in skill-building workshops and are also paired with a mentor on Mosaic's staff to learn about a variety of projects including:

- Designing and writing social media content
- Stewarding our Castro Valley land and water




