Dear Mosaic Community,

As we sat down to express our deep gratitude for your support this year, writer's block hit like never before. How could we possibly express the meaning of your gifts in our efforts to bring just a little more peace to the world? How could we communicate the strength you give us as we struggle to maintain hope in the midst of the escalating hate and violence surrounding our children?

We're increasingly seeing adults demonstrate the opposite of what we teach at Mosaic. They are not using our 3 Keys to Peace: 1. Listening (true listening, rather than just listening for an opening to attack), 2. Empathy (doing our best to understand another's feelings and needs), and 3. Assertiveness (being strong without being mean). Instead, they are using the 3 Peace Blockers: 1. Blame, 2. Guilt, and 3. Defensiveness. We see examples all around us of adults taking sides rather than promoting peace, hurt people hurting other people, and violence begetting violence.

In our despair, we are reminded of why we started Mosaic — not because children have trouble getting along, but because adults do. We teach children these peacemaking tools and show them **peace is possible** so they can grow up capable of building a better world. As always, we find hope in our students because they do get it! Here are some of their words from the fall Outdoor Project season we just wrapped up:

Before, if someone yelled at me or hit me I would hit them back. But Mosaic has changed me and showed that I could use my words or walk away to cool down.

This year, we celebrated the complete return of our signature program, the Outdoor Project. We were able to run both fall and spring sessions for the first time since the pandemic. We served 947 4th and 5th graders from 27 schools.

The Outdoor Project brings together
4th and 5th grade classes from markedly
different communities for a profound
weeklong experience in nature. Our dynamic,
experiential education, based on proven
research in social-emotional learning, is
designed to address issues of difference, build
self-esteem, and inspire inclusion. Students
learn through shared challenges, exciting
"gametivities", honest discussions, and the
power of song.

100% of teachers report they saw positive behavioral changes in their class after attending the Outdoor Project.



The In-School Project deepens and sustains the impact of our Outdoor Project by providing workshops for teachers and caregivers, as well as by introducing Mosaic lessons and skills from the very beginning of elementary school and cultivating them throughout the grade levels. This year, we provided interactive musical assemblies, workshops, and two-day retreats for nearly 5,000 elementary and middle school students as well as 300 teachers and caregivers.

The Youth Leadership Project provides extensive training for youth ages 15–23 who serve as mentors for the younger students at the Outdoor Project and form a vibrant cross-cultural community. They also engage in leadership and volunteer opportunities at Mosaic events, workshops, fundraisers, and service learning projects. Over 120 Youth Leaders participated in our Youth Leadership Project this year.

The Mosaic Consulting Project provides experiential education programs for companies, organizations,

and schools that want to invest in creating an inclusive, equitable, productive work environment. We served nearly 500 participants through our Consulting Project this year. We were also proud to receive the Partners in Educational Excellence Regional Award from the Association of California School Administrators (ACSA) as a result of our consulting work with the Castro Valley Unified School District.

Online Resources include our original music, updated Action Guides for Businesses and Families, and our evergrowing Activity Bank. This searchable database currently contains 80 lesson plans for our peace-building curriculum for all ages, making our resources easily accessible to our partner teachers and beyond!

To fulfill our commitment to serve a population that mirrors the diversity of the San Francisco Bay Area, The Mosaic Project intentionally serves schools and organizations that differ markedly in socioeconomic, racial, and cultural make-up. In 2023, we served nearly 7,000 individuals directly and thousands more through our virtual resources.

adults through the Mosaic Consulting Project The Mosaic Project partners with elementary schools from across the San Francisco Bay Area to bring 4th and 5th graders to our signature program, the Outdoor Project. We unite three or four classes from schools that differ socioeconomically, racially, and culturally in each weeklong session. We also serve the entire student body of each of our partner schools, as well as the teachers and caregivers, through our In-School Project.

Ninety percent of our 4th and 5th grade Outdoor Project participants report that the experience changed them. Their transformation includes wanting to **spread peace**; understanding how

to be assertive; and applying the Mosaic lessons of Mutual Respect, Open Mindedness, Self Respect, an Awesome Attitude, Individuality, and Community.

One hundred percent of our Youth Leaders say that their Mosaic experience was transformational and that they are now more likely to include others. Nearly all participants say that because of The Mosaic Project, they are better able to work with and build relationships with others, resolve conflicts, empathize, be assertive, and address stereotyping.

100% say Mosaic was transformational.

Outdoor Project Alumni

Our lessons are not easily forgotten. When surveyed after five years, nearly all responding alumni state that, because of The Mosaic Project, they are more likely to empathize with those

different from themselves, more likely to interrupt discrimination, and better able to resolve conflicts peacefully. The surveys are also evidence of something else — that special lightning that Mosaic manages to capture in a bottle. One of the most common words our alumni use to describe their experience is "magical."

We are excited to introduce The Mosaic Classroom Project, designed to bring Mosaic lessons directly to 4th and 5th graders in schools around the country, and even the world!

We are partnering with <u>True Stories</u> and the Elm Street Foundation to create this unique experiential curriculum incorporating our signature dynamic "gametivities", stories, and songs, along with documentary-style films. The films highlight the experiences of eight 4th and 5th graders at the Outdoor Project this past fall as they build new skills,



friendships, community, and peace.


This project will enable 4th and 5th grade classes anywhere to accompany these featured students on their Mosaic journey, experiencing the week through their eyes and learning alongside them.

True Stories is currently editing the films and we are refining the curriculum. We will pilot the project in at least four classrooms this March and officially launch it in the 2024–25 school year. We are looking forward to seeing how

far we can expand our reach through the Classroom Project!
