Dear Mosaic Community,

How is it possible that I am feeling simultaneously heartbroken and immensely grateful?

We are approaching our 25th anniversary year. Thanks to your generous support, I've been doing this work for a very long time! After all these years, I was surprised to feel particularly inspired by our most recent season at the Outdoor Project. I was more profoundly moved by our students' transformation this fall than I can remember. Perhaps this was just a special season, or maybe I was exceptionally present, or most likely, it is because of the stark contrast of our dedicated young peacemakers against the backdrop of our conflicted world.

I keep replaying this single moment in my mind.

Our students were completing a challenging activity—one which required them to work together to create a representation of the inclusive, just, and joyful world they want to see. Nine-year-old Ethan looked up at me and proclaimed, "Look! We're doing it! We're changing the world, and that's what Mosaic is all about!" He was bursting with excitement and pride. One month later, I still smile when I think of it, and at the very same time I feel devastated.

Our students do have the skills, passion, and hearts to



change the world, and yet the world we're handing them needs so much changing! It is daunting. Although I believe that both cynicism and hope are choices, right now it often feels impossible to choose hope.

But then I think of another moment involving this same student, Ethan. He and his group were nearing the end of Conflict Resolution College where our students earn their Doctorates in Conflict Resolution (CrDs). For their final exam, they had to resolve an improvised, dramatic conflict between the staff. Ethan asserted to his arguing teachers, "Remember what you taught us! If you taught us something, you gotta use it in your own lives!"

He's right. I don't think we actually have a choice. We must actively seek hope. That's what we teach. We must use the Mosaic lessons in our own everyday lives, care for each other, and affirm that peace is possible. As our children are exposed to more separation, hate, and violence in the larger world, The Mosaic Project will continue to surround them with examples of what an inclusive, peaceful, just, and joyful world can look like—as well as provide them with the tools to create it.

Thinking of Ethan and all of our young Mosaic peace-makers, I am motivated by the words of activist Marian Wright Edelman: "You can take a moment for tears, but then go get some rest and get back up in the morning and keep fighting for the children." As we enter our 25th year, I'm ready to keep fighting. I am so thankful to know you are with me.

Our complementary work with youth and adults not only supports our youngest peacemakers, but also enables us to reach wider communities through schools, community-based organizations, and the workplace. Together, we create microcosms of the just, diverse, inclusive world we envision, demonstrate that peace is possible, and inspire action.

This year, we served 930 4th and 5th graders from 30 schools through our flagship program, the Outdoor Project.

The Outdoor Project brings together 4th and 5th grade classes from markedly different communities for a transformative weeklong experience in nature. Our dynamic, experiential curriculum, based on proven research in social-emotional learning, is designed to address issues of difference, build self-esteem, and inspire inclusion. Students learn about equity, empathy, assertive communication, conflict resolution, and more through shared challenges, exciting "gametivities", honest discussions, and the power of song.

100% of teachers report they saw positive behavioral changes in their class after attending the Outdoor Project.



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The In-School Project deepens and sustains the impact of our Outdoor Project by providing workshops for teachers and caregivers, as well as by introducing Mosaic lessons and skills from the very beginning of elementary school and cultivating them throughout the grade levels. This year, we provided interactive musical assemblies and workshops for nearly 3,500 elementary

schools students as well as 480 teachers and caregivers.

The Youth Leadership Project provides extensive training for youth ages 15–23 who serve as mentors for the younger students at the Outdoor Project and form a vibrant cross-cultural community. They also engage in leadership and volunteer opportunities at Mosaic events, workshops, fundraisers, and service learning projects. Over 145 Youth Leaders participated in our Youth Leadership Project this year.

The Mosaic Consulting Project provides experiential education programs for companies, organizations, and schools that want to invest in creating an inclusive, equitable, productive work environment. We served nearly 450 participants through our Consulting Project this year.





Our Online Resources include our original music,
Action Guides for Businesses and Families, and our Activity
Bank. This searchable database of peace-building curriculum
for all ages makes our resources easily accessible to our
partner teachers and beyond!

We are excited to share our Classroom Project Showcase, highlighting some of our favorite films from our newest program! (Password: 3Keys). The Mosaic Classroom Project is designed to bring our lessons directly to 4th and 5th graders in schools around the country, and even the world! We are partnering with True Stories and the Elm Street Foundation to create this unique experiential curriculum incorporating our signature dynamic "gametivities", stories, and songs, along with documentary-style films. The films spotlight the experiences of

eight 4th and 5th graders at the Outdoor Project as they build new skills, friendships, community, and peace. This project enables 4th and 5th grade classes anywhere to accompany these featured students on their Mosaic journeys, experiencing the week through their eyes and learning alongside them. This year, we piloted the program in 10 schools reaching 600 students. We will officially launch the Classroom Project in 2025 and look forward to expanding our reach.

To fulfill our commitment to serve a population that mirrors the diversity of the San Francisco Bay Area, The Mosaic Project intentionally partners with schools and organizations that differ markedly in socioeconomic, racial, and cultural make-up. In 2024, we served over 6,000 individuals directly and thousands more through our virtual resources.

The Mosaic Project partners with elementary schools from across the San Francisco Bay Area to bring 4th and 5th graders to our signature program, the Outdoor Project. We unite three or four classes from schools that differ socioeconomically, racially, and culturally in each weeklong session. We also serve the entire student body of each of our partner schools, as well as the teachers and caregivers, through our In-School Project.

to be assertive; and applying the Mosaic lessons of Mutual Respect, Open Mindedness, Self Respect, an Awesome Attitude, Individuality, and Community.

One hundred percent of our Youth Leaders say that their Mosaic experience was transformational, they are now more likely to include others, and they are better able to resolve conflicts without using violence. Nearly all participants say that because of The Mosaic Project, they are better able to work with and build relationships with others across difference, empathize, be assertive, and address stereotyping.

Outdoor Project Alumni

Our lessons are not easily forgotten. When surveyed after five years, nearly all responding alumni state that, because of The Mosaic Project, they are more likely to empathize with those

different from themselves, more likely to interrupt discrimination, and better able to resolve conflicts peacefully. The surveys are also evidence of something else – that special lightning that Mosaic manages to capture in a bottle. One of the most common words our alumni use to describe their experience is "magical."



We are infinitely grateful to Scott and Molly Forstall who generously purchased the land where we are building our future!


