Teacher Re-Entry Guide

Simple tips for teachers dealing with the post-Mosaic blues

The First Monday Back

Part of re-entry is using your Mosaic skills and reminding your students to do so too. During this transition from Mosaic back to the classroom, it is normal for kids (and teachers) to go through a storming period. What types of things can they do to keep Mosaic going at school? Get their ideas! See what you can come up with together as a class.

In the meantime, these fun and simple tips can help for a smooth transition and keeping the magic alive for them and for you!

Try starting out the school day or after any transition with leading the class in 3 deep Mosaic breaths. Have a parent (or you yourself can) bake a batch for the class and ceremoniously hand them out after the assignment is complete! You can even take it a step further and ask each student aggressively, "Do you want a cookie?!" to which they must respond assertively, "Yes" in order to receive it.
